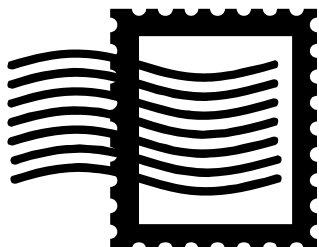

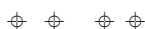

From the President

Collectively, our GLHSC membership possesses a vast amount of knowledge about the joint pursuits of philately and gay and lesbian history. But, tapping into that resource base to answer questions or verify facts isn't always easily accomplished. Sometimes, the "facts" themselves don't always agree.

Because history itself is an ever changing and expanding field, new information comes to light all the time. And because in many cases, the private lives of historically prominent individuals were hidden from the public eye, we sometimes have to offer up conjecture when it comes to listing these people in our journal.

Of course, we always temper our beliefs with as much solid historical research as possible (and unfortunately, in some cases, this is not much). For instance, I know that I read an article about 15 years ago at the University of California at San Diego's massive main library about Adelbert von Chamisso, who discovered the California Poppy (known as *Eschsholtzia californica*). This was in the pre-internet days, where one actually went to the library and looked on cards using the Dewey Decimal System.

Von Chamisso named the flower after a fellow who was his expedition mate on the Russian natural science ship, S.S. Rurick, in San Francisco in 1816. His name was Dr. Johann Friedrich Eschscholtz and this article seemed to give credence to the idea that the two men were quite close and perhaps even intimate with each other. I remember being quite surprised, as I had never even heard of these two men, let alone that my state flower was named after a gay man.

I then promptly filed away this tidbit of historical data. Our editor is always in need of articles for the Journal, so I thought, here's a great story for the GLHSC newsletter! When I went to the internet to do some further research, I couldn't find one single reference to the possible relationship between von Chamisso and Eschscholtz. How could this be? I know I remember reading about these two men in the library a long time ago, and now, I couldn't find anything even remotely supporting this.

My point is we are all stronger as a group than we are individually. And collectively, what we can offer each other is a vast resource of information not likely found in much of mainstream media. Let's each of be willing to offer up some information to the rest of the club, even if it is in the form of a question about an historical or philatelic item they have run across in the past. Does anyone know about von Chamisso and Eschscholtz? I'd love to hear from you if you have information on these two explorers.

What other topics would any GLHSC member like to ask our membership about?

Eva Charlotte Dahlgren-Attling was born June 9, 1960 in Umeå, in the north of Sweden. She started to play the guitar when she was a teenager. Bruno Glenmark discovered her when she performed on the TV program called "Sveriges Magasin". The result was her debut album, "Finns det ågon som bryr sig om", released in 1978. It was produced by Bruno and Anders Glenmark. Anders has produced all of her albums, except "Lai Lai".

In 1980 she released the album "Eva Dahlgren", an album on which she criticizes and explains women's feelings and the problems they encounter when wanting to show these feelings to another person. She also sang the melody for the radio program "Eldorado". Between 1981 and 1984 she received three Rockbjörn (a prize given by the Swedish newspaper Aftonbladet) as "Best Female Artist of the Year". She performed with, and met her future wife, Efva Attling, at the 1982 Rockbjörn ceremonies.

She toured around Sweden, Finland, Norway and Denmark throughout the 1980's. Success found her in 1989 with the release of the song "Ängeln i rummet". The song was also included - in English - on an album for Greenpeace. In 1991 she released, "En blekt blondins hjärta". This has been her best selling album to date. The album also helped her garner 5 additional grammies.

Her Scandinavian tour lasted until 1992. She took a break from the music scene for some months. In December 1993, Eva returned to the stage, though changing her format somewhat. She left the guitar at home and changed it for a conductor and an orchestra. The conductor was Esa-Pekka Salonen. After this concert, she started recording a new album with Esa-Pekka and the composer, Anders Hillborg. Esa-Pekka conducted the Stockholm Symphonic Orchestra, Anders composed the classical music and Eva wrote the poems/lyrics and sang.

The album was called "Jag vill se min älskade komma från det vilda". It was released in 1995 and resulted in another Grammy as "Artist of the Year". She also won another Rockbjörn for "Best Female Artist."

Efva Attling was born February 18, 1952 in Stockholm. Efva began her career as a model and traveled to such cities as New York, Paris and Milan. She returned to Sweden in the early 1980's, forming the band X-Models. By the mid-80's, Efva went solo. In 1985 she married the Swedish musician Niklas Strömstedt, and in 1988 they had their first child, Adam. She had her second child, Simon, in 1992. She began to concentrate on designing clothing and jewelry in the early 1990's. She currently has jewelry boutiques in Helsinki, London and Stockholm.

In 1994 Eva and Efva again crossed paths. With Efva's marriage to Niklas ending in 1995, Eva and Efva spent much time together during 1995 and fell in love. They were married on January 25, 1996.

In March 1999, Eva released "Lai Lai", an album produced, recorded and performed by her. She worked on this album while in Sitges, Spain. That same month she went on another Scandinavian tour. This tour was such a success that she decided to tour Sweden again in summer. She played with Bo Kaspers Orkester, Jennifer Brown, Robyn and Ulf Lundell in various locations throughout the country and at the Stockholm Water Festival.

In September 2001 she published her first children's book, *Lars, Urban & Pudelstjärnan*. On December 10, she released the single "Too Many Believes", which was written after the September 11th attacks and recorded in October while she was in Japan for the "Swedish Style Week" in Tokyo.

In September 2003, her second book about Lars and Urban was published under the title *Lars och Urban och faster Los hemlighet*. She also performed at Anna Lindh's (Swedish Foreign Minister killed in Stockholm) funeral, where she sang a very emotive "Ängeln i rummet".

Currently Eva is working on a new solo album and writing a third book about Lars and Urban. Efva continues to design jewelry. You can find more information about Efva's projects on her website www.efvaattlingstockholm.com.

Sweden Post issued a booklet of eight stamps to celebrate the 50th anniversary of rock 'n roll on October 2, 2004. The stamps features Jerry Williams, Elvis, Eva Dahlgren, Ulf Lundell, Tomas Ledin, Pugh Rogefeldt, Maria Anersson from *Sahara Hotnights* and Louise Hoffsten. A sheet of nine Elvis stamps was also issued.

This is the 'infamous' first gay postmark which Jesse Helms denounced on the floor of the Senate. Copy of newspaper article included. \$6.00
- C. (3/16/1990) FDC of UN AIDS stamp (Scott #573) on WFUNA Keith Haring cacheted envelope. \$4.00

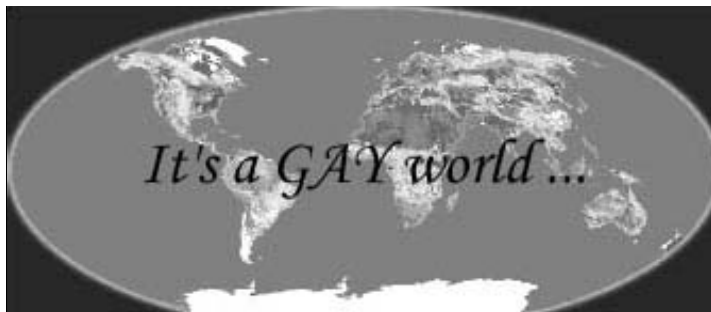

The New Zealand post office issued a set of stamps in July that feature scene locations from *The Lord of the Rings* movie trilogy. Do any GLHSC members know if Sir Ian McKellen is featured on any of these stamps?



Grenada issued a sheet of 12 stamps featuring American Indian Chiefs on April 19, 2004. Sitting Bull can be found on Scott no. 3439k.

Guyana issued a set of four stamps and a sheet of four stamps on February 16, 2004. Paintings in the Hermitage, St. Petersburg, Russia are featured. *Hercules Between Love and Wisdom* by Pompeo Girolamo Batoni is depicted on Scott no. 3845b.

Monaco issued a single stamp on June 14, 2004. The design features Sergey Diaghilev, George Balanchine and Les Ballet Russes de Monte Carlo. Scott no. 2339.

Palau issued a set of four stamps and a souvenir sheet for Christmas on December 1, 2003. Three paintings by Botticelli can be found on Scott nos. 741, 742 and 744.

Romania issued a set of four stamps honoring famous people on May 27, 2004.

George Sand, Scott no. 4641.

Oscar Wilde, Scott no. 4642.

Sierra Leone issued a sheet of three stamps and a souvenir sheet on July 1, 2003, in honor of the 500th anniversary of the painting of the Mona Lisa. The sheet is Scott nos. 2630a-c. The souvenir sheet is Scott no. 2631.

It is highly doubtful that Tajikistan would have issued stamps bearing the likeness of Magic Johnson or Freddie Mercury.


Tanzania has declared many stamps illegal in the 1996-1997 time frame. The stamp bearing a likeness of Arthur Ashe was issued in this period of time.

The postal authorities of Turkmenistan have stated the stamps featuring Freddie Mercury were not authorized. They should be considered illegal.
